- Duties included investigating vehicle related Frauds, owner give ups, dealership frauds etc. As well as chop shops and when requested organized theft rings.
- Certified in Fire Investigations as a Level 1 Fire Investigator, investigated suspicious fires including building & vehicle arsons.
- Certified in Health & Safety – Participated on the Health and Safety Committee, conducted Health and Safety checks and Critical Injury Investigations when required.
